**6.** To elect Vice Presidents. B Blanden proposed all existing Vice Presidents be re-elected en-bloc, seconded by C Sercombe. All were in favour.

**7. To appoint auditors.** K Hovers proposed that Bishop Fleming were appointed, seconded by T Ward. All were in favour.

8. Any other business. There was no other business.

The Chairman handed over to Lord Inglewood on-line to address the meeting. Lord Inglewood thanked Dan Phipps for chairing the AGM. Lord Inglewood paid tribute to Henry Plumb in his role as President of European Parliament and in promoting UK agriculture and gave a brief summary of his view of the agricultural topics likely to be prominent in Parliament. Part of the long-term agenda for agriculture will be to find ways to mitigate emissions but current world situations have highlighted the vulnerability of food supply. Apriority will be to secure the funding from Government to support agriculture and food production and regulate imported food so that it complies with the same standards as UK farmers.

Lord Inglewood thanked everybody for attending. The meeting was closed at 11.35am.
