The end of October 2019 doesn't feel that far behind us but how things have moved on since then. We avoided the tariff infested waters of a no deal EU departure, went headlong into a General Election, and then fairly rapidly concluded a withdrawal deal which meant we left the EU at the end of January. The mid February Cabinet reshuffle saw two long standing NSA contacts take up key roles. Rishi Sunak replaced Savid Javid as Chancellor, a key role that normally (nothing is normal at the moment) controls the purse strings, and then George Eustice was elevated from Minister to Secretary of State for Environment.

Rishi Sunak is MP for Richmond in Yorkshire and it was only 3 years ago that I accompanied him around 4 sheep farms in the north of England, following that up with meetings in London. George Eustice we know well from his time as Farming Minister and it can only be helpful that our new Secretary of State is up to speed with sheep farming issues. In theory we have two people who have a good understanding of our industry, one who makes decisions and one who holds the cheque book – what could be better! Of course we know it won't be like that but we are in a better place than we were even a week ago. A quick breath and a sigh of relief because by March we will be into trade negotiations that could be difficult – and could take us back to those tariff infested waters after the end of December 2020. It hardly seems right that as sheep farmers we spend so

much time talking politics but agricultural policy, plus the policy areas of food safety, immigration, international trade and the environment just to mention a

few, affect us massively. It is essential that we help to shape policy to create an environment in which we can thrive – particularly when we all know that the business we are involved in is such a positive one that is threatened by a lot of misinformation.



Communicating our industry to those outside is something that the farming industry has not been good at, although that is changing rapidly and the NSA is playing our part in many ways and taking up any opportunity we can. But we also have to stay tuned in to the changing world we are living in and we are now facing two key challenges that I don't see going away:

1. Raising our productivity and
2. Maintaining and improving our environment - in its widest sense.

Productivity is not a measure of how much we can produce and it's not about feeding the world. It means profit margins - widening the gap between income and expenditure, and that can be done in many ways depending on the sheep farming system. Be in no doubt that increasing productivity and

profit is all about reduced reliance on Government support, something that is coming our way.

A quality environment is something that increasingly we should be able to sell – public money for public goods. We've had over 25 years of agri environment schemes where we started a journey of 'selling' environmental land management to the tax payer, but this was calculated on the basis of what we lost by doing it so no real reward and no great value. Over time I see public goods broadening but for now we have ELMS being developed, tested and trialled, and planned for roll out in 2024.

In the meantime a simplified countryside stewardship scheme is in place to keep us going while BPS starts to get eroded. As individuals a lot of policy development is out of our hands but productivity and producing and selling quality public goods is something we can do and this is exactly where the Eastern region winter fair comes in. The organisers, Jonathan and Carroll Barber and others within the NSA Eastern region committee, have worked hard to put on an informative and enjoyable day with the support and involvement of Melton Mowbray market -a thriving business and service that has held its place in the heart of the local community and contributes to building awareness in a way that is so important. I wish everyone a worthwhile and enjoyable day and I defy anyone not to come away having learnt something of value.

Making Every Lamb Count

Clostridial diseases and pasteurellosis are both silent killers. Typically, the first sign farmers will see is a dead animal, often losses can be catastrophic.

MSD Animal Health are urging farmers to protect their lambs; in an era when proven and highly cost-effective vaccines are available, no lamb should die from a clostridial disease. Any loss is an entirely avoidable loss.

Clostridial diseases are caused by a group of bacteria that share the same environment as sheep. These organisms are ever present, existing in soil, on pasture, within buildings and even in the tissues and organs of healthy sheep.

For much of the time, clostridial bacteria remain dormant and effectively harmless; in the form of highly resistant spores that can survive for many years. However, when certain commonly occurring trigger factors – ranging from changes in management/feeding and/or sudden cold snaps to parasitic activity – stimulate these clostridial bacteria to multiply, the resulting release of lethal toxins causes disease signs that virtually always lead to very rapid death of adult sheep or lambs.

The situation with *Pasteurella* bacteria is similar. *Pasteurella* organisms can be found naturally in the throat of healthy

sheep and once again it is stressful events that can trigger disease. Pasteurellosis outbreaks are seen mainly in very young lambs – in the first week or two of life – and quite often in 6-10-month old lambs in the autumn after a change of management.

The key message is that it's almost impossible to control the multiple and varied stress-related 'trigger' factors for clostridial disease and pasteurellosis in lambs. The widespread bacteria and different infections they cause can affect lambs at various ages.

The best advice, therefore, is to make sure all lambs receive early (from three weeks of age), broad-spectrum vaccination to cover themselves against these unpredictable and potentially devastating disease threats.

The importance of British Wool

Joe Farren, CEO, explains the critical role of British Wool in the UK sheep industry.

BW: Is British Wool a profit making organisation?

JF: Not in the traditional sense. Our profits are the returns we give to the 40,000 producers who send their wool to us. As a farming co-operative, we are owned by our producers – the returns we provide for our members recognise the true market value of the wool.

BW: How has competition changed over the past few years?

JF: There has been a distinct change in competitive dynamics over the past 4-5 years. The 'direct from farm' Irish competition is now owned by the two largest downstream processors in the UK who actually buy from our auctions at Bradford. Their aim is to maximise profits through driving wool prices down in the long run and increasing their market share at our auctions.

BW: What would happen to wool prices if British Wool weren't there?

JF: Put simply, prices would plummet. If you look at the example of the Republic of Ireland, it does not have a British Wool alternative and the same direct from farm buyers who operate in the

UK dominate the market. Prices there are typically 50% lower than those we return to our producers. Such a severe drop in wool prices in the UK would inevitably see the rates paid to shearing contractors come under pressure and drop significantly as a result.

BW: How can British Wool give better returns to producers for their wool?

JF: The competition use our prices as a barometer and price at substantial discounts. Our aim is to maximise the value of our producer's wool whereas the competition want to pay as low a price as possible to enhance their own profits. This is why British Wool have and will continue to offer consistently better returns than the competition. This price premium will increase over the coming years as our consumer marketing strategy matures and we increase our Chinese customer base through our Shanghai Office.





AHDB supports NSA Winter Fair

AHDB Beef & Lamb is proud to be exhibiting at this year's NSA Winter Fair. The Knowledge Exchange team will have a range of sheep experts on hand to answer all of your technical questions at its stand.

But that's not all, each person has their own specialism within sheep farming such as health, selection and breeding, so can discuss a range of challenges and areas of interest you may have.

Though BCS is a topic all sheep farmers are familiar with, Nerys will talk about how getting ewes into the correct condition doesn't just affect the lamb's birthweight but can have a much longer term impact on the lamb's growth rates and how it thrives in the crucial first few months. Nerys will also provide some data on her recent survey on how and when

farmers assess condition and discuss some of the barriers identified. There will also be time for questions at the end.

Feeding into this is AHDB's February focus campaign. #ColostrumIsGold concentrates on the importance of good quality colostrum and its benefits. Colostrum provides antibodies that form the main part of a strong immune system from birth. This can reduce and even prevent the need for antibiotic treatments in the new born or older animal. Remember the three Qs: quantity, quality and quickly.



Main Building (Not to scale)


