Sheep Scab Kate Hovers BVSc CertSHP MRCVS

NSA Cymru continues to be busy representing the interests of sheep farmers in Wales.

One initiative is the stakeholders' group on Sheep Scab. Both Helen and, myself sit on the group which I chair. We are a non-funded group pooling our ideas and resources to help make a difference. After a setting the scene meeting, we went on to set some priorities around prevention; testing and treatment; environmental issues. We are awaiting guidance from Welsh government on their future control programme and have had positive meetings regarding communication and working together.

We obviously endorse the SCOPS information as industry best practice and intend to promote this further, we will have Welsh language versions available shortly.

We may have secured a budget for a media information campaign this Autumn (watch this space) by which time we should know details of future Welsh Government funded scab control projects.

I have enjoyed chairing this group as the very different stakeholders are all working together and contributing in a positive way.





NSA Cymru Development Officer update Helen Roberts, NSA Cymru Developement Officer

Since our first newsletter the year is moving at a fast pace and I am sure we are all looking forward to the Royal Welsh next week (Just hope it is not quite so hot).

We have a number of new exhibitors in the NSA Pavilion so please do come and take a look at the breed, trade and technical stands which can offer an array of advice in this ever changing world. Each day there will be a short 20 minute talk from MSD covering Practical tips to get the most from sheep vaccination with Q & A to follow.

This session will include discussion of: correct handling, storage, cleaning and use of vaccination guns, particularly in the light of the discontinuation of the Sterimatic System.

Correct vaccination positioning and technique to reduce the risk of adverse reactions.

The best ways to handle, transport, store and administer vaccines. Which animals should and should not be vaccinated to ensure best value for investment.

The talks will be around 1pm with the NSA building or on the NSA stand, so please feel free to join and find out more, if you can't make these then please do call and see us for a tea and a natter, it will be good to catch up with Members old and new.

Quick on the heels of the Royal Welsh it will be all hands on deck for the NSA Sheep Event on the 27th July at the Three Counties Show Ground, the event has a fantastic line up of seminars, workshops over 250 trade stands, competitions and demonstrations etc. Details for tickets can be found <u>here</u> and all other information <u>here</u>

NSA Cymru will then play host to the National Sheep Association AGM on Thursday 11th August 2022, 10.00am, Doladron Farm, SY22 6JR by kind permission of the Bennett family. Following the AGM there will be a farm walk.

Alun, Helen and family have experience of a variety of sheep breeds and always aim to breed quality sheep.

The family established their Plasucha Lleyn flock in 1996, growing it to



600 breeding ewes. The flock has had much success since its

formation, selling Lleyn ewes up to 2,000gns and a tup for a joint breed record price of 18,000gns to Laga Farms, Orkney.

Their eldest son, Robert showed a keen interest in the sheep growing up and established the Plasucha Texel flock in 2006; this is made up of approximately 30 breeding ewes. The flock has had much success winning at National shows such as the Royal Welsh and Great Yorkshire and has sold males to a top of 32,000gns and females to a top of 18,000gns.

After purchasing a hill farm in Llanerfyl, Alun and Helen now also run a 250 head flock of MV accredited North Country cheviot hill ewes. In 2021, the flock was awarded the Champion Hill Type flock in the Wales and Borders flock competition.

To breed their own MV accredited mule ewes they also run a small flock of MV accredited traditional blue faced Leicesters. Alun and Helen purchased 8 females at the Rossibank dispersal sale in Carlisle in 2016 and the family have bred their own mules for the last 3 years. The family lamb 400 ewe lambs outdoors in April/May.

Facilitate networking within the sector to bring people together to realise new ideas, attend workshops, training sessions, visits and to increase awareness and knowledge of the sector.

Wool Manifesto for Wales, a document that shares a vision for the sector in Wales, created by stakeholders involved in all parts of the supply chain.

NSA welcomes Welsh Government announcement on the Sustainable Farming Scheme

NSA has welcomed announcements from Welsh Government on the Sustainable Farming Scheme, but recognises that there is still some way to go before a practical scheme is ready for roll out in 2025. These announcements give Welsh farmers the first look at future schemes moving away from BPS and Glastir.

NSA Chief Executive Phil Stocker said 'Welsh Government is clearly keen to be working with farmers and related stakeholders to co-create this new scheme in preparation for roll out in 2025. The document sets a sound set of principles, WG recognise they don't have all the answers, and they are keen to co-create the detail with farmers and their organisations (such as NSA). It is encouraging to see that future schemes are set to reward practical actions on farms which many of our farmers are working towards already. NSA has been working collaboratively with Welsh Government and is encouraged to see that much of the recommendations from industry have been included, with strong recognition of the importance of food production in Wales, and the beneficial role farming can and is having on the environment and wider landscape. NSA will welcome further discussion especially around payment rates to ensure Welsh farming businesses are able to maintain financial viability, resilience, and productivity.'

Mr Stocker continues "The Sustainable Farming Scheme policy document clearly talks about the principle of land sharing where farm land can simultaneously deliver for food production, for the climate, for nature, and for culture and the public. However there is still much detail to be ironed out such as ensuring tenants can access the scheme and aren't limited by tenancy agreements, and getting to grips with how this will work on common land and cross border farms, and considering short term grazing agreements. The proposals include a requirement for 10% of the land area to have tree cover, to include well managed hedgerows, and this includes existing tree and hedgerow cover. This may be challenging for some landscapes where open common land for example forms a large proportion of the holding. We will be discussing practical issues such as this with the WG team as their work progresses and try to stay focussed on appropriate outcomes rather than standardised prescriptions."

The announcement outlines 'A baseline payment will be made to farmers for undertaking a set of Universal Actions which can be delivered by farms across Wales and go above and beyond what is required by legislation. Additional payment will be available for farmers who choose to undertake extra Optional and Collaborative Actions.' With further detail explaining 'The Welsh Government wants to engage with farmers from across Wales to understand how the proposed actions could work on their farms as part of the next phase of co-design. To help farmers carry out the actions, support will be offered through an advisory service, as well as training and farmer-to-farmer knowledge sharing. Payment rates are being informed by Welsh Government modelling and economic analysis which is still being undertaken.'

NSA Cymru Regional Development Officer Helen Roberts said "Farmers across Wales are well placed to tackle climate change but also maintain and enhance a reputation for world renowned produce and build on the strong cultural reputation that Welsh farming delivers. It is encouraging to see commitment from government that it will work with farmers to co-design the future schemes, and NSA Cymru will continue to work collaboratively with government on routes to ensure proper support is provided for rural communities through the Aqriculture (Wales) Bill due this Autumn."
