

FARM FACTS

- Peterhayes Farm is (320-acres) of stony clay loam 91m (300ft) above sea level
- Mount Pleasant Farm is 49ha (120-acres) of clay loam 198m (650ft) above sea level
- Further 35ha (86-acres) grass keep
- 90 Hampshire ewes lamb mid-December
- 100 Suffolk ewes lamb February
- 300 Romney ewes lamb March of which two thirds are bred pure
- 120 British Friesians calve year round at Peterhayes

TRADITION and technology work hand in hand at Peterhayes Farm, just outside Yarcombe in Devon.

The Derryman family has farmed here since 1916 when Henry's grandfather took on a Church Commission tenancy. The family then bought the farm in 1962. Despite significant changes in government agricultural policy since then, dairy and pedigree sheep are still core to this mixed farm.

Sales of breeding stock remain the priority. Repeat buyers for Hampshire Down, Suffolk and Romney females and rams are a clear indication five generations of Derrymans are still respected stockmen.

And the fact Henry, his sons Robert and

Peter and the latter's son Philip are all receptive to new technology ensures the Yarcombe flock prefix keeps a high profile both in the show and sale ring - as well as a constant stream of private buyers. "We don't do anything fancy here but always have in mind any enterprise must complement our type of farm," explains Peter.

The 90-strong Hampshire flock was established 53 years ago. The Yarcombe flock, one of the society's largest, has its focus firmly set on ram production. These ewes lamb mid-December allowing ewes and lambs to turn out onto emerging grass growth from the lambing shed. Lambs are creep fed from the go with those not fit for future breeding sales finished by Easter at 40kg lw.

Between 40 and 50 ewe lambs are kept for breeding. About 35 Hampshire rams are sold annually.

The Yarcombe flock has been a regular feature in interbreed lineups for years now. Henry and Hilary first showed a pair of ram lambs at Devon County in 1971. One of the family's greatest achievements was securing the Signet interbreed championship with a ram in 1987. Suffolks were introduced in 1983 when Peter, in particular, was looking for another breed. This 100-ewe flock is based three miles away at Mount Pleasant Farm where Peter lives with his wife Cathy.

Peter's brother Robert was keen to introduce a self-replicating commercial breed 17 years ago to utilize steeper rented ground. There are now 300 Romney ewes lambing in March. Two thirds are bred pure; the remainder to a

Suffolk or Hampshire.

The Derrymans have performance recorded since the scheme's inception. "Recording has helped the breed achieve commercial goals – especially leaner carcasses in the Hampshire Downs," explains Henry.

Peter agrees: "This management tool has been a great benefit to both us and our customers who buy into the steady genetic improvement achieved over the years. Progeny has consistently recorded indices in the top 10% for all traits. "Even though performance results are an obvious sale tool we still have to enjoy looking at our stock every day so all sheep must be good on their legs, stand square and have good front and back ends,"

"There are, however, other traits you can't see: Cold weather tolerance makes all the difference some years. And as nearly a third of our Suffolk rams are sold into Mule flocks to breed female replacements, maternal traits are also very important," adds Peter who is, however, concerned about the increasing costs associated with performance recording.

A majority of the farm is down to permanent pasture. The farm, in an area of outstanding natural beauty (AONB) on the Blackdown Hills is in mid-tier stewardship. Long-term grass leys are complimented by a 14ha (35-acre) spring barley rotation, into which an increasing number of herbal leys have been introduced.

"The chicory in them was a godsend last summer and these herbal leys do seem to have anthelmintic properties," says Philip



who also direct drills kale for the 80-odd shearling rams running across the farm overwinter. This green crop is drilled into the spring barley stubble.


Five years ago Philip invested (with the help of a grant) in Shearwell's electronic identification and management system. Each sheep is pre-populated with every lamb electronically consigned to its mother at birth when double tagged preturnout.

"The system saves so much stress and time. Group wormings, vaccinations and weighings are recorded as well as all movements using the hand-held reader. It is a godsend when we are selling rams off-farm as there is no need for all those individual movement licences," explains Philip.

"I think the sheep industry is doing a good job: We just need to get better at promoting it," says Peter. "Phil Stocker, the National Sheep Association's chief executive is very good at fighting our corner in Whitehall. But I don't understand why wool – which is such a fantastic product – isn't worth more. Something has got to click on that front somewhere soon as it is such a wasted opportunity."

BLUEFACED LEICESTER'S 'THE BUSINESS BREED' Main Sponsor

Delivering Unrivalled Hybrid Vigour, Prolificacy, Milkiness

The Bluefaced Leicester evolved from a breeding programme to develop longwool sheep in the 1700's by Robert Bakewell

The Bluefaced Leicester Sheep Breeders Association was established in 1962 to encourage the breeding and maintain the purity of the Bluefaced Leicester Sheep. Now in our 61st year and with a current membership of 1,419 the Bluefaced Leicester Sheep Breeders' Association is one of the biggest in the UK and Ireland.

The Bluefaced Leicester is crossed with many of the native British breeds, particularly hill breeds including Swaledale, Scotch Type Blackface, Northumberland Type Blackface, North Country Cheviot and Welsh Mountain to produce the Mule. The term Mule means any cross bred sheep sired by a Bluefaced Leicester, the mule is the most numerous cross in the United Kingdom Flock. The main attributes of the breed are, prolificacy, and milking ability and its ability to transmit unrivalled hybrid vigour in to its first cross

The Bluefaced Leicester should have a broad muzzle, good mouth and a characteristic Roman nose, bright alert eyes and long erect ears. There should be a good length of neck laid into broad shoulders and a good spring of rib and a long strong back with no weakness behind the shoulder. The hindquarters should be broad and deep, the legs well positioned and strong boned. The wool should be tightly purled, fine and open cleanly to the skin.

More proactive approach needed to tackle sheep wormer resistance

Survey data shows that only one in five sheep farmers are currently following SCOPS advice and incorporating a newer group 4 or 5 wormer active into their annual programme, raising industry wide concerns about the rate at which wormer resistance is continuing to develop.

Wormer resistance presents a significant threat to the UK sheep sector and the industry has been calling for urgent action to address the problem so that effective worm control options remain available in the future.

A crucial part of current recommendations is for all flocks to introduce a newer wormer active. While the majority of farmers surveyed – 87 percent – are taking some practical steps to slow down or prevent resistance to the older group 1, 2 or 3 wormers, only 19 percent of farmers surveyed have taken this important action.

The data indicates that this may be, inpart, due to farmers believing that they are unaffected by resistance, with 59 percent having not tested for wormer resistance and 54 percent not checking the efficacy of their wormer post-treatment.

Matt Colston, ruminant technical consultant at Elanco, explains that regardless of a farm's current resistance status, SCOPS advice is to use a newer group 4 or 5 wormer for lambs during the mid-late season, and as a quarantine dose for all incoming sheep.

"Overuse of any wormer group will increase the rate at which resistance develops to that group. Strategically introducing a group 4 wormer, before there is a visible problem, is therefore vital," he says.

"Updating your worm control plan to include the use of the group 4 wormer, Zolvix™, for lambs in the latter part of the grazing season, will help slow the development of resistance to the older wormers, while clearing out any resistant worms that may be compromising lamb growth and performance.

"When used as a quarantine treatment, Zolvix will minimise the risk of resistant worms being brought onto the farm," explains Mr Colston.

The survey showed that for those already using Zolvix, half use it as quarantine treatment and 42 percent use it as a mid-late season break dose for lambs, when best practice would be for all farms to include it at both of these key points.

Waiting until there is an visible resistance issue to any wormer group leaves little room for manoeuvre when it comes to managing the worm challenge, and Mr Colston emphasises the importance for all sheep farmers of following the advice from SCOPS (www.scops.org.uk).

"The results suggest that a significant proportion of farmers are unknowingly feeding wormer resistance, and if we want healthy, productive sheep and profitable sheep farms in the future, this is something that we must work harder to change".

Profit from sheep: introducing a high output, low-cost foragebased system with the Highlander

Adopting a relatively high output, low-cost forage-based sheep enterprise with the complementary Highlander is the way to go, says Exeter based Chris Berry. "I'm as confident as I can be that our system is proving to be sufficiently resilient and profitable going forward under the new support regime without relying on payments.

"In the last five or so years we've turned around what was a traditional high input sheep enterprise; we've reduced purchased concentrate by 95%, fertiliser by 55% and we've cut the fuel bill while increasing output of lamb and cattle from 240kg/ha to 280kg/ha," he explains.

"Despite the 2022 drought combined with the fact our farm is within one of the driest parishes in Devon, our Highlander ewes scanned 181% with just 2% empty. The flock has achieved a five-year rearing average of 160-165% lambs, a volume we're happy with for a March outdoor lambing system. Fertility is reflected in the entire flock lambing within 35 days. Ewes are maintaining themselves in BCS 3.0 to 3.5 throughout the season and averaging four to five crops. Add together the performance benefits and they're also contributing towards reduced emissions."

A portion of the Highlander flock is bred to the Focus Prime, a terminal sire from Innovis bred specifically for Kepak. "We introduce the rams in ratio of one to 80-100 ewes. Lambs reach 18-19kg target weight and grade R3L or better by an average 20 weeks."

Chris who farms in partnership with his parents, Michael and Michele says he experienced that



light bulb moment after spending time studying in New Zealand and witnessing successful low input systems.

"I returned home to lambing 650 ewes, they were a lot of work and I was aware labour would be a future issue. Around the same time, I heard about the New Zealand bred Highlander from Innovis; here were genetics that could work hard for us instead of us working hard to manage the sheep." In 2015 the Berrys agreed to a transitional change from split lambing to one March outdoor lambing group, grade up their traditional Mule and Lleyn cross flock to Highlanders and introduce a rotational grazing system.

"Nowadays I have help at lambing from one apprentice working a nine to five day. We check the flock three times daily and intervention is running at an acceptable 2-3%. Motherability is good, the ewes have well-formed udders and plenty of milk, they keep an eye out for their lambs, while the lambs have that essential vigour which makes them a lot less vulnerable to predators and inclement weather," he says adding: "We've established a solid platform going forward but there's always room for improvement, and for us that includes improving soil health."

Increased feed costs are making many Farmers look at re-evaluating forage use in an effort to reduce input costs however the levels of trace elements in the forage may be perfectly adequate to maintain the livestock but may reduce the performance required and stop them reaching their genetic potential.

Especially as many flocks are already nutritionally stressed due to the drought in 2022 and the unusual Winter / wet Spring.

There are 92 naturally occurring elements found in soils, however only 27 of these are classified as essential for animals. Essential elements are required for maintenance and growth, reproduction and health, these are divided into 2 groups dependent on their concentration in the body, namely the Major or Macro elements and the Micro or Trace elements.

Trace Elements contribute to the oxygenation of blood, repair of cells and tissue, development of rumen microorganisms bone & muscle growth etc. and allow the animal to utilise protein, carbohydrate and fat, in fact after oxygen and water they are the 3rd most important item for life and provide the ruminant animal with energy for growth and production, and it should be noted that many trace elements work closely with vitamins

Deficiencies in the UK are often not caused by a lack of a particular element, but are more likely caused by interactions with high levels of one element interacting and acting as an antagonist preventing the absorption or locking up of another mineral element. Heavy clay soils carry higher natural levels of elements while light sandy soils tend to be depleted.

Many farmers assume that treating the soil, crop, feeding buckets etc will solve all problems, sometimes it will! The difficulty arises when we start to understand that each animal and their individual requirements differ due to stage of growth, lactation, induced stress levels, for example

newborn lambs that are weak and unable to stand or fast growing heavier muscled breeds such as Texel, Beltex or Charolais lambs dying for no apparent reason may actually be a Selenium issue
